Attention Armada Village and Armada Twp Residents, your elected officials have made the decision to move to a single waste hauler program. What does a single waste hauler mean for you? Reduced prices, less wear and tear on your roads, safer environment for your children, and added service benefits.

Priority Waste has been chosen to be this hauler effective March 1, 2026.

If you are a current Priority customer, your new rate will be reflected on your April 1, 2026 invoice, along with a credit for your March services.

If you are a new customer, please call **586-228-1200** to sign up for services. With your service, you will get a trash and recycle cart delivered to your home. If you would like additional carts, you can request them at www.prioritywaste.com/municipality/armada-mi/

The cost per additional cart is \$125.

Priority has a dedicated number for service inquiries. **This number is 586-210-0151.**

Current priority customers do not get new carts unless they are adding on recycle services

If you are in the Village, your new service day will remain on Thursday. If you are in the Township, your service day will be switched to Tuesday's, beginning March 10th.

Pricing

- Trash - \$48.00 per quarter
- Recycle - \$12.00 per quarter (optional service)
- Yardwaste - \$4.00 per month (optional service for Village residents only)

Important Information

- Weekly 95-gallon trash service
- Weekly 65-gallon recycle service
- Weekly yardwaste service April 1 to November 30 (Village Only)
- Bulk pick-up the first service day of the month
- Christmas tree pick-up December 26 to January 15
- Transfer station drop-off the third Saturday of each month

SUSTAINABILITY GUIDE



Some communities rules and guidelines may vary

Recycling

All material should be placed loose in the recycling cart.

Paper



Newspaper, office paper, magazines, junk mail, cardboard/paperboard boxes broken down.

Metal



Aluminum, steel and tin cans – empty and rinsed.

Glass



Clear and colored bottles and jars – empty and rinsed, can leave lids on.

Plastic



Bottles, jugs and containers/tubs – empty and rinsed with caps/lids on. Examples: water/pop bottles, milk jugs and detergent containers, the containers would be like butter tubs, yogurt, sour cream, cottage cheese, etc.

Consumer Packaging



Egg cartons, broth containers, coffee cups, milk cartons – empty and rinsed.



Not sure if its recyclable?
When in doubt, throw it out.


Trash
